As part of this invaluable experience, transition themes were explored around pupils' personal development: self-confidence, resilience, friendship, and community. Pupils had an opportunity to spend time together and reflect on how to achieve their best at The Barlow.

The pupils, staff and governors who participated had a brilliant time; laughter and fun was had by everyone. All Year 7 pupils achieved their 'Transition Award' for taking part, receiving a certificate commemorating the day. Well-done to everyone involved!



Celebrating Diversity

This month we have been celebrating Black history and diversity within the curriculum. **Pupils** have had opportunities to celebrate the underrepresented in Science, such as Mae Jemison. Born in Chicago, Mae initially studied engineering at Stanford University. She became the first black woman to travel into space. Another female scientist celebrated was Rosalind Franklin. Born in Notting Hill, Rosalind played a key role in the discovery of DNA structure.

Speaking of Notting Hill, our assemblies celebrating Black History Month focussed on the work of two women contributing to the inception of Notting Hill Carnival. Claudia Jones desired to celebrate the Caribbean culture in London when she moved to England from Trinidad and Tobago in 1955. As editor of influential black newspaper, The West Indian Gazette, she organised events to celebrate

black identity through song and dance with the aim of creating unity within London. Rhaune Laslett-O'Brien continued Claudia's work, bringing song, dance, and costumes to the streets of Notting Hill. Pupils also learnt about Lilian Bader: the first black woman of the Women's Auxiliary Air Force during World War Two. Her perseverance saw her become a first-class aircraft woman. Throughout her career, Lilian continued to promote women in the armed forces and was a walking example of the contribution Black and Asian women have within this sector.

This important celebratory month will culminate in our annual 'Show Racism the Red Card Day' where our school community unite to show support by wearing something red in celebration of our multicultural and diverse Barlow Family!

NATIONAL POETRY DAY


Enjoying, discovering and sharing poetry

Following on from this, they had the opportunity to take part in an online poetry writing workshop, recorded by Simon Mole, the UK's National Poetry Day Ambassador. The tutorial resulted in some wonderfully creative pieces of poetry which were read aloud and celebrated in lessons, with the top poems going through to our English Faculty competition.

Meanwhile, in Family Time sessions, pupils were invited to explore a poem written by one of the nation's favourite children's poets, Brian Moses. His poem'Instead' gave pupils food for thought, encouraging them to have time away from screens and technology in order to rediscover the magic of imagination.

All in all, National Poetry Day 2021 was a brilliant opportunity for pupils to join the rest of the country in a celebration of poetry.




World Teachers' Day 2021

Additionally, our RFU coaches have been able to resume their Rugby coaching every Tuesday after school and numbers are growing impressively, although we would love to see more Year 7 and 8 pupils attend. On Wednesday evenings both cricket and tennis are proving very popular with girls and boys alike. Trampolining Club and Fitness Club also have growing numbers. It is great to see the Sports Hall bulging at the seams every lunch-time with table tennis and badminton proving very popular.


Friday 10th September On celebrated our patron and local saint -St Ambrose Barlow.
