This is a national award, developed by the National Children's Bureau in recognition of outstanding work being done to promote health and wellbeing across school communities in the UK.

As a Catholic school, wellbeing is at heart of everything we do and so the WAS award was a natural progression for us. It has also afforded us the opportunity to benchmark our practice as well as guide us to ensure that we have a high-quality support offer in place for all members of our school community.


The WAS journey has been a robust process spanning almost two years, which has been timely to support us in navigating the Covid pandemic and subsequent response to ensure that we have been equipped to meet the emerging needs of our school community during this challenging time.

The project was led by our 'Change Team', which comprised: Mrs Redford - our Mental Health and Wellbeing Link Governor, Mrs Staniforth, our Designated Safeguarding Lead and WAS Co-ordinator, Mrs Lutman our HOY 7 and joint Chaplaincy Co-ordinator, Mrs Wilcox, our PSHCE Co-ordinator, Mrs Seddon, our SENDCo, Mrs Holland, our Pupil Leadership Lead, Mrs Fisher, our HLTA and one of our school's Mental Health First Aid team and two of our pupil leaders.

It's fair to say that the group have been a real tour de force throughout this journey demonstrating great commitment, creativity and resilience to ensure that all aspects of the award criteria have been addressed and evidenced, which has served as a platform to celebrate the extensive good practice throughout the school.

Once again, unsurprisingly, it was our pupils that shone bright during this process; our WAS Award Assessor commented after her final verification visit: 'I would like to reiterate how much I enjoyed visiting your school. The pastoral offer that I observed, alongside the stakeholder feedback, was positive and demonstrated effective working. In particular, the pupils I met with were very impressive; showcasing confidence, leadership skills and an articulate manner.'

We are immensely proud to have received this prestigious award and are more determined than ever to ensure that this important aspect of our work in school remains high profile and that our whole school community continue to benefit from a high-quality mental health and wellbeing support offer.

#### **Return to Sports City**

Sports Day 2022 was a very special event in The Barlow calendar. It was the first time we have been able to hold our annual Sports Day at Sports City since 2019.

Many of our Year 8 pupils had never had the opportunity to visit and compete at this world class facility which hosts many national and international competitions. It was great to be back.

#### **Recruitment & Selection of Pupil Leaders**

The application process for the prestigious positions of Head Girl, Head Boy and their Deputies for the academic year 2022-2023 was more rigorous than ever before.

Following their written application, pupils had an interview with a senior member of staff to secure their position as a prefect. Shortlisting for senior roles then took place, where twenty candidates' applications were discussed in detail.

The successful interviewees were then set their first challenge! They were asked to deliver a short speech in a Year 10 assembly, explaining why they would be an impactful Head Girl or Boy. It is very nerve racking to stand up and deliver a speech to 170 peers. The pupils did superbly well; their passion for The Barlow shone through.

They were confident and articulate and a real credit to our school community and to themselves. Following the speeches, Year 10 were asked to vote via Microsoft Teams for who they thought would best represent the year group in this very important role. Staff were also given an opportunity to vote.

Finally, the candidates attended a three-stage interview with the Headteacher, the Key Stage Leader and the Associate Assistant Headteacher responsible for Pupil Leadership. This involved reading a passage, delivering a pre-prepared speech and answering some demanding questions.

All the pupils performed to a very high standard and all showcased their unique characteristics and qualities.

Choosing Head Boy and Head Girl is one of the most difficult jobs in the school year but also one of the most pleasurable. A long-time was spent deliberating.

#### **Formby Field Trip**

Fifty Year 8 geography pupils spent a sunny Friday learning about geography field work techniques in two very different locations in Merseyside.

They started the day looking at coastal processes and sand dune succession on Formby beach. It was brilliant to see pupils relishing the opportunity to learn outside the classroom in such a stunning location. Pupils were lucky to have the technical assistance of Mr Hodges, our science technician, who assisted them in surveying vegetation changes along three different sand dune transects.

In the afternoon, pupils headed into the bustling, popular tourist destination of Southport. They completed land use surveys and used questionnaires to collect qualitative data about the perception of tourism around Southport Pier. Pupils also found time to sample the icecream! As you might expect, pupils had a superb day and gave staff really positive feedback about the experiences they had.


We cannot wait to see you all again in September.
